2022 Year In Review



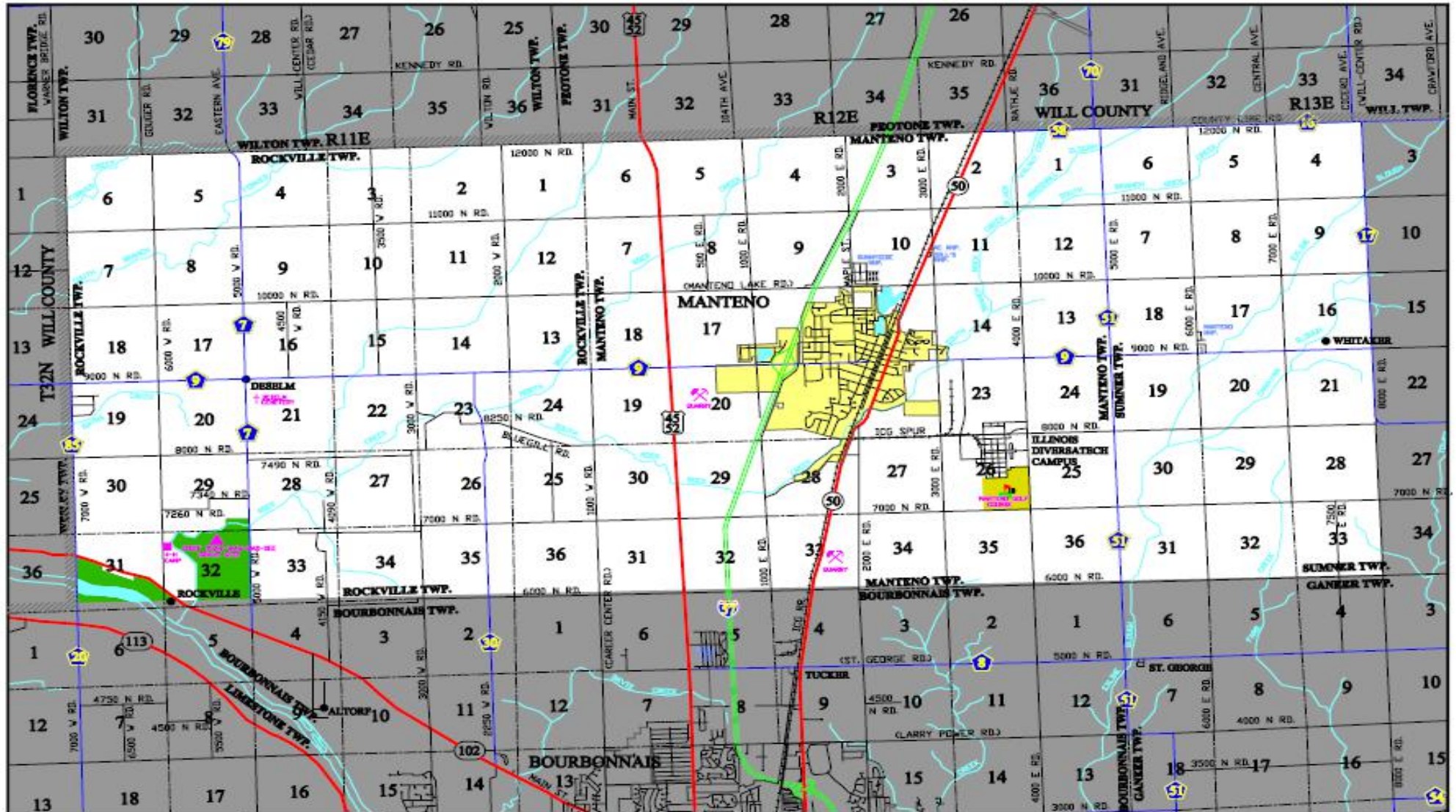
The Manteno Community Fire Protection District was established in 1948 protecting 96.3 square miles. The Fire Protection District boundaries are from county road 6000 North as our south boundary, to county road 12000 North or "County Line" as our north boundary. From county road 8000 East or "Whitaker" to the east, and county road 7000 West or "Warner Bridge Road" to the west. The Fire Protection District provides fire and ambulance service to approximately 12500 residents. The Fire District has 2 stations; both staffed 24 hours a day. The Fire District employs a Fire Chief, 3 Battalion Chiefs, 3 Lieutenants, 18 Full Time Firefighter/Paramedics, and 6 Paid-On-Call Firefighters.

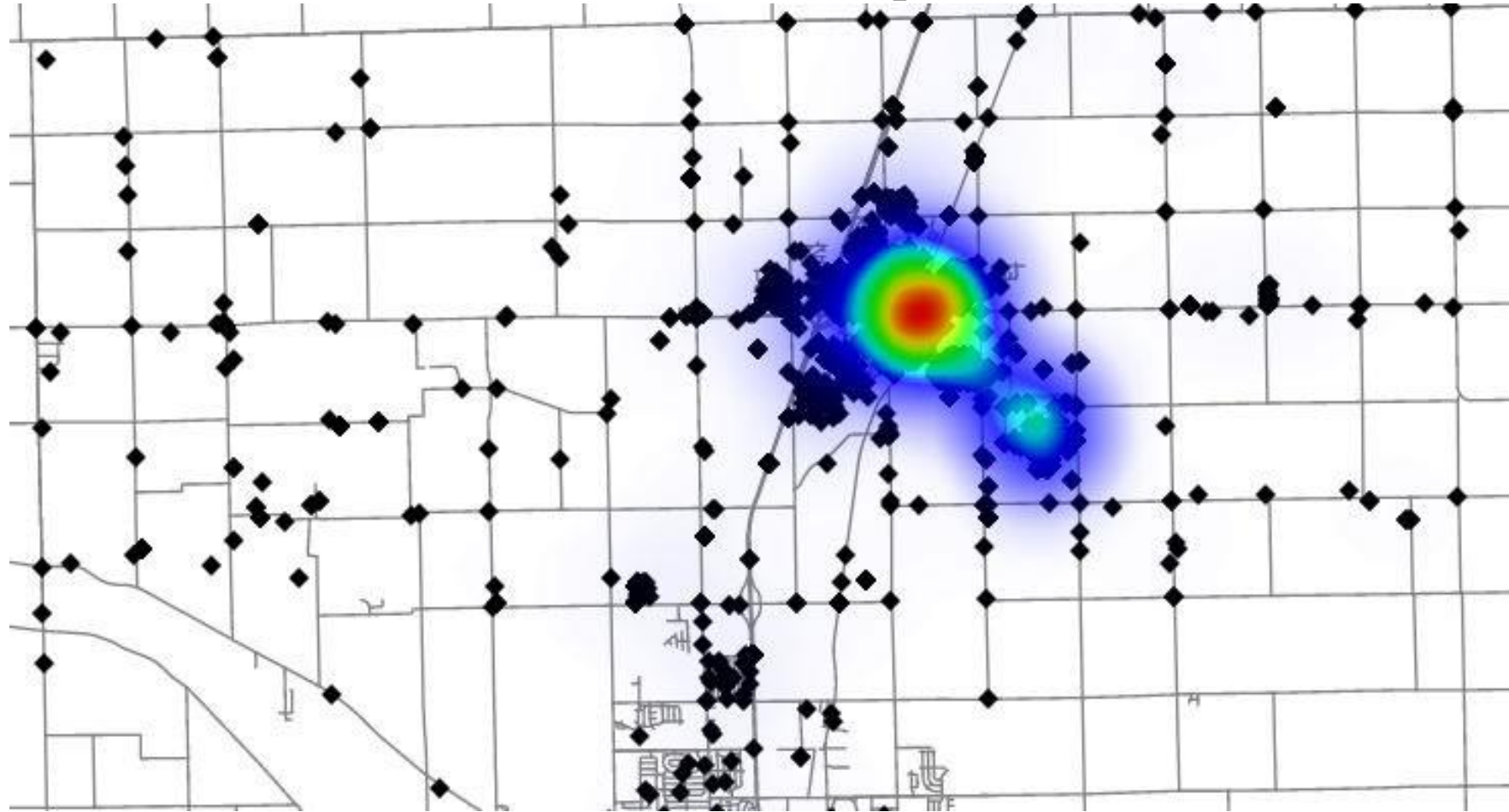

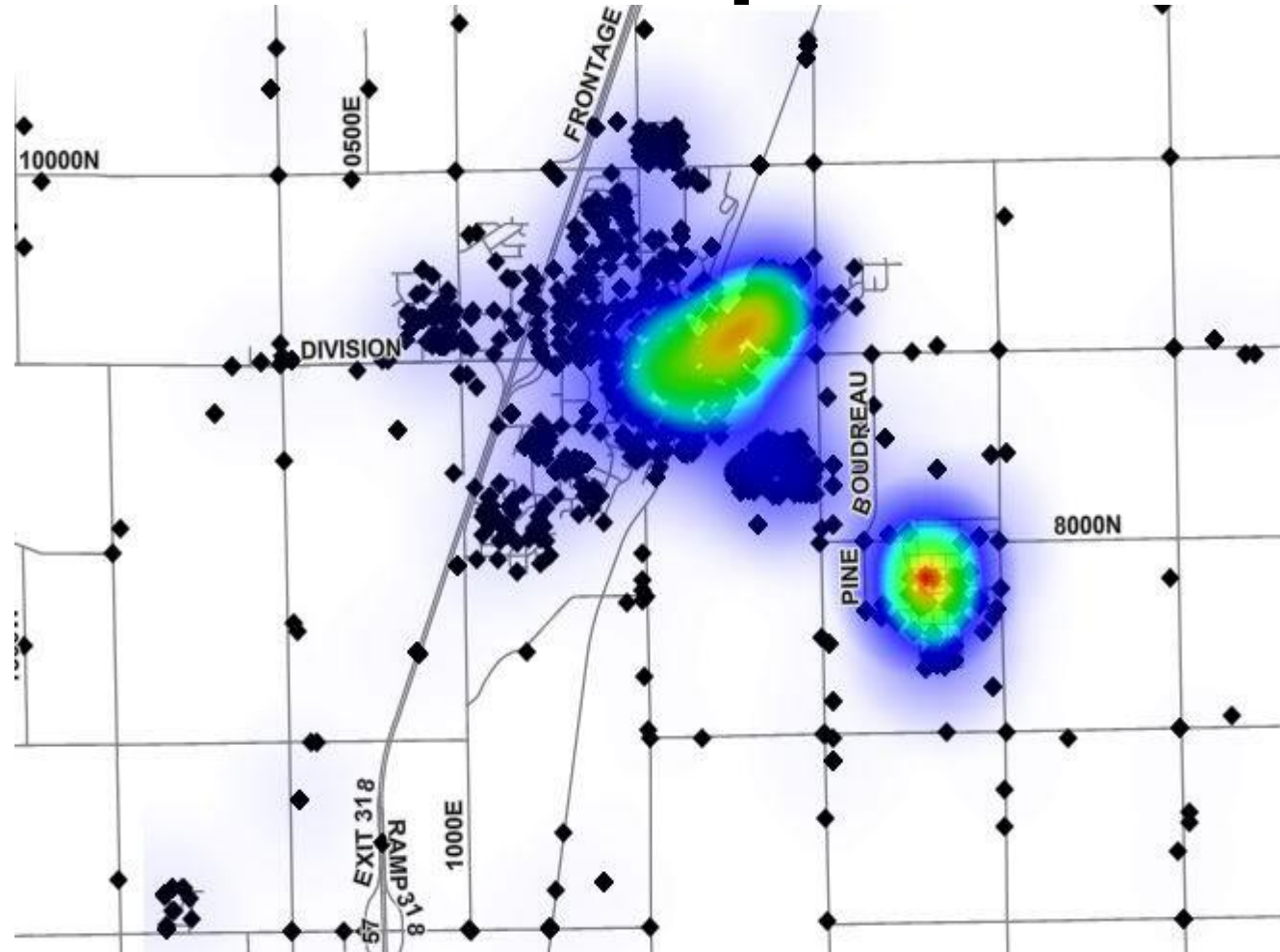


2022 Incident (District) Heat Map



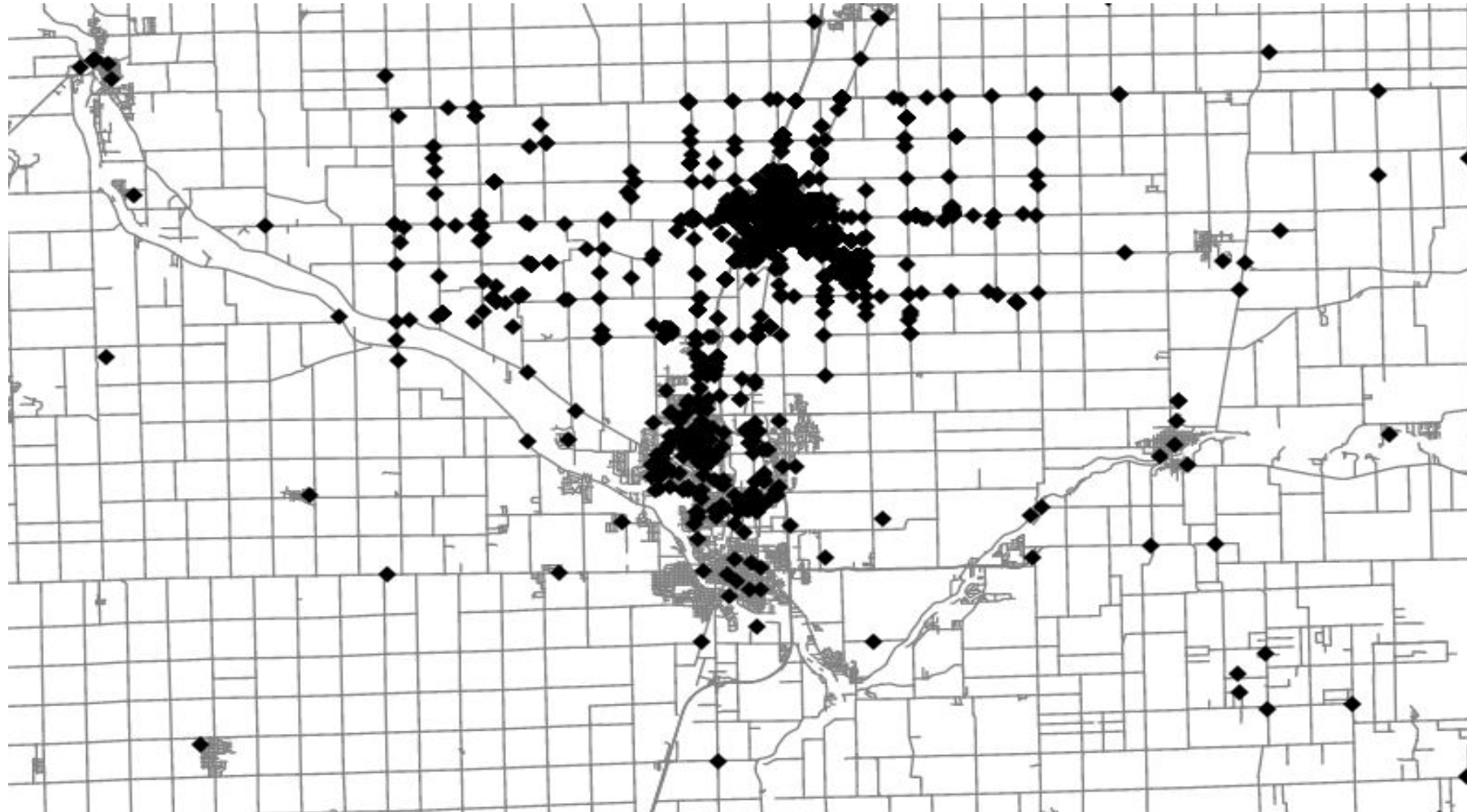


2022 Incident (Village) Heat Map



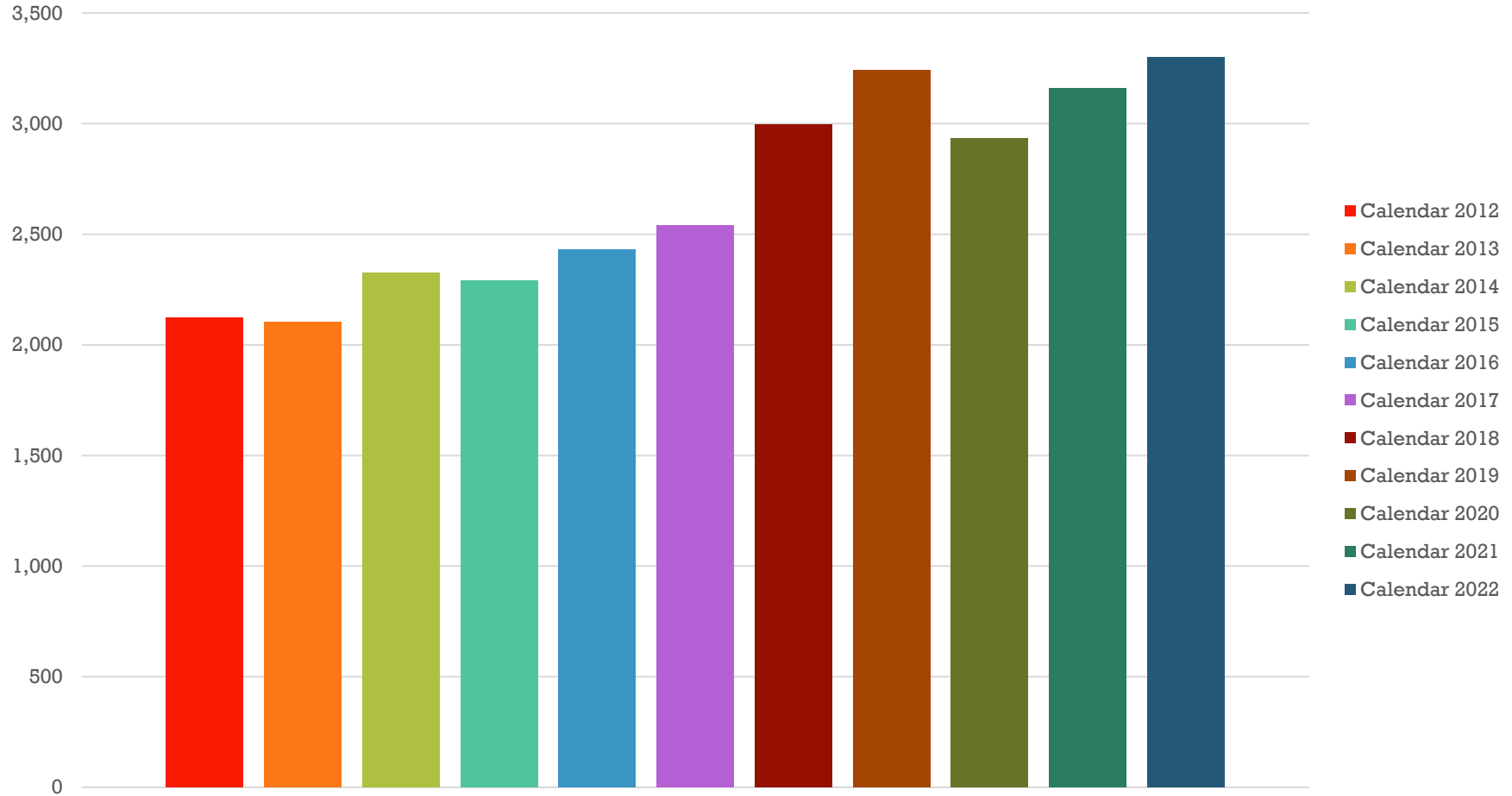


2022 Incident (Overall) Map

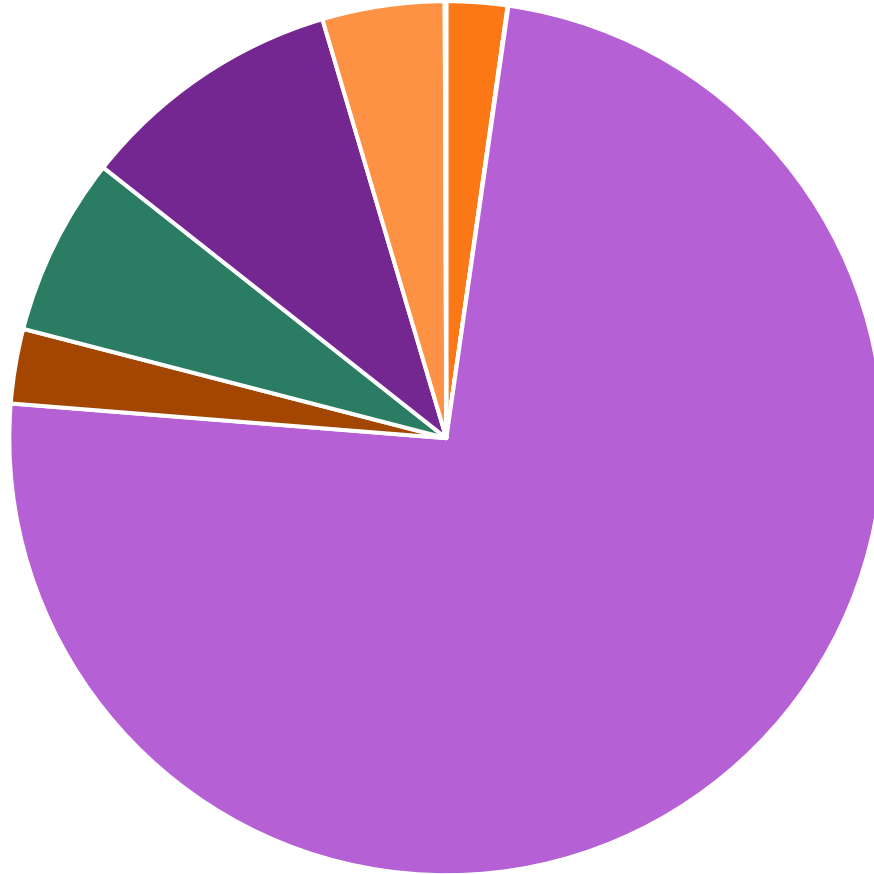

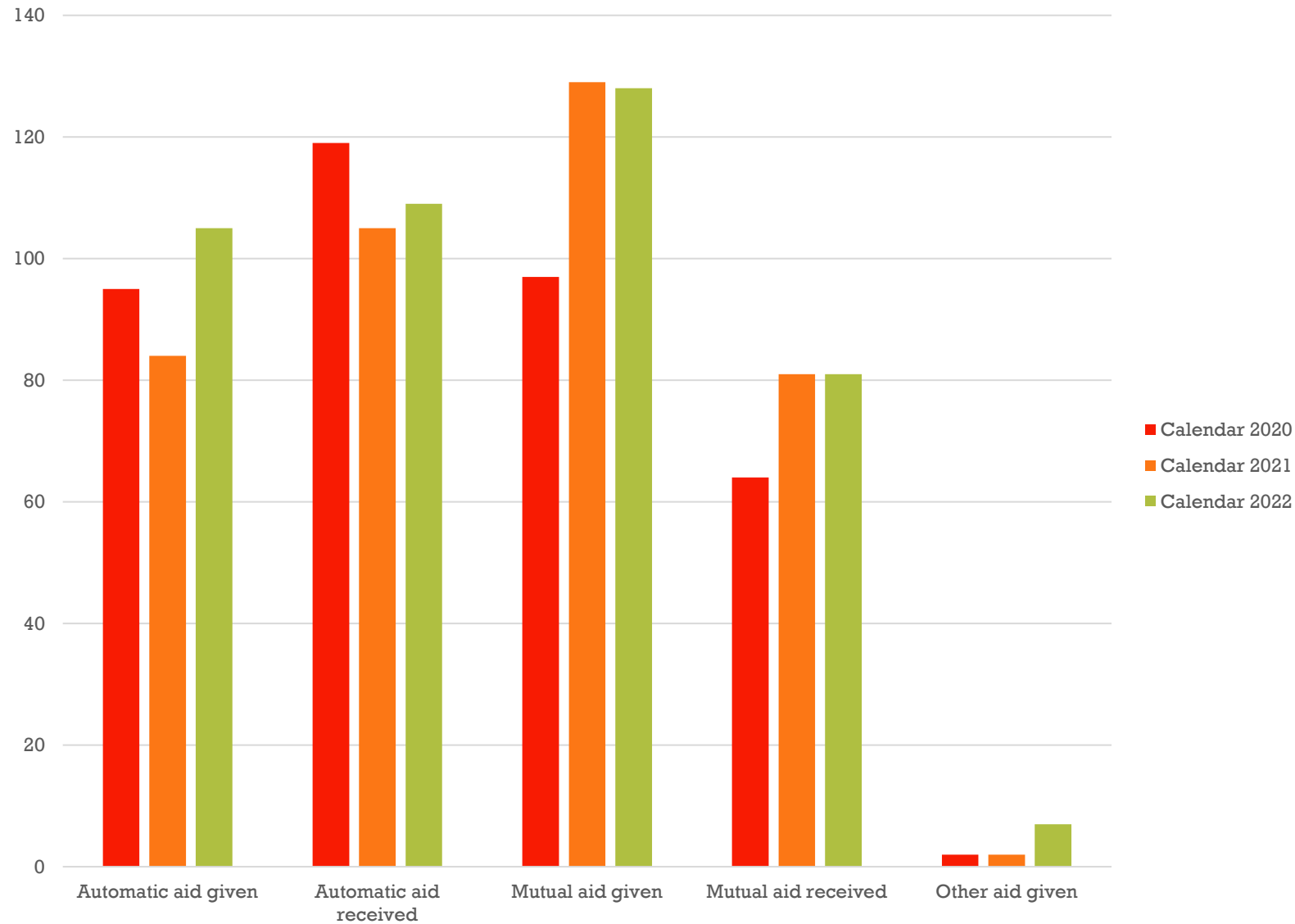

Simultaneous Incidents

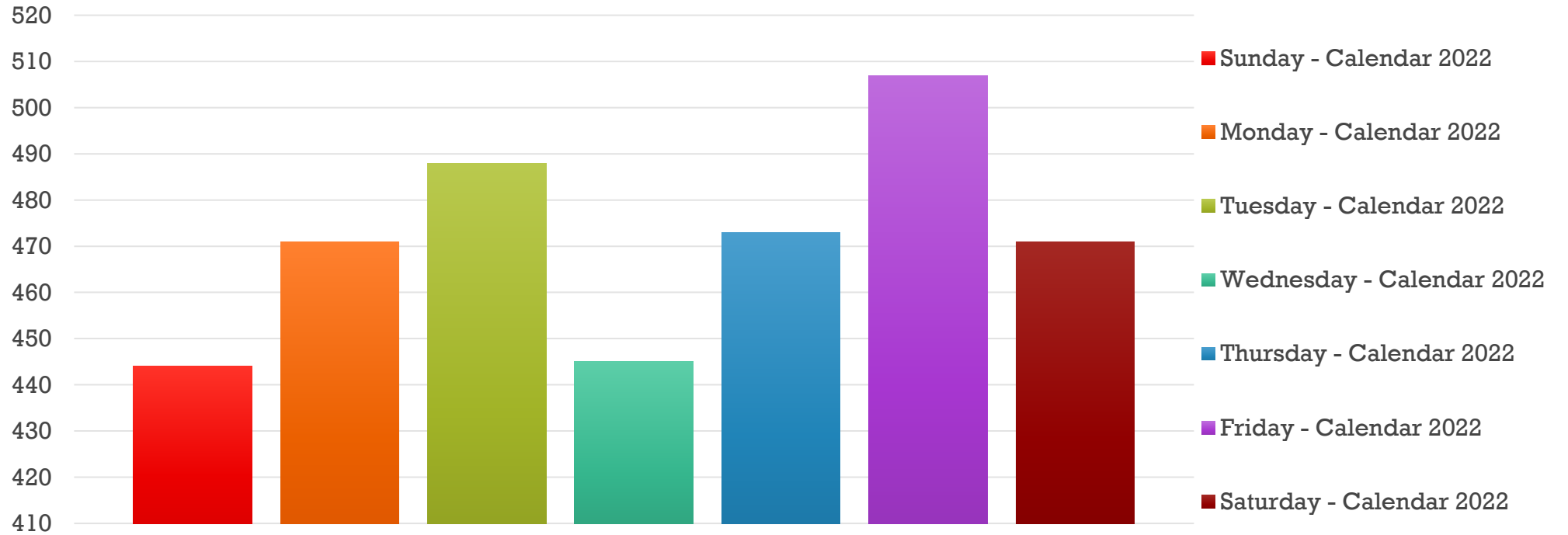

2020	33.72%



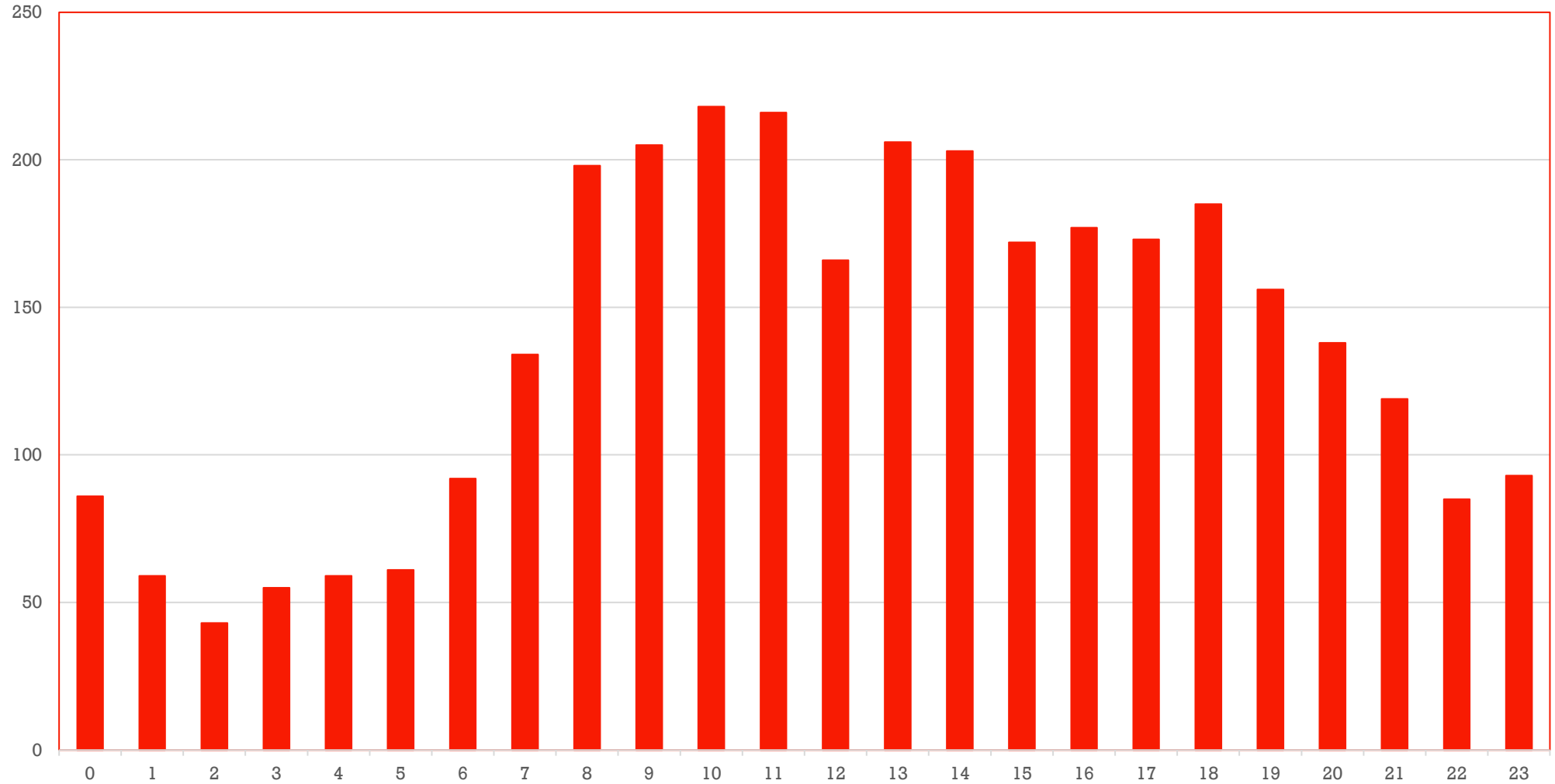


Day of the Week - 2022



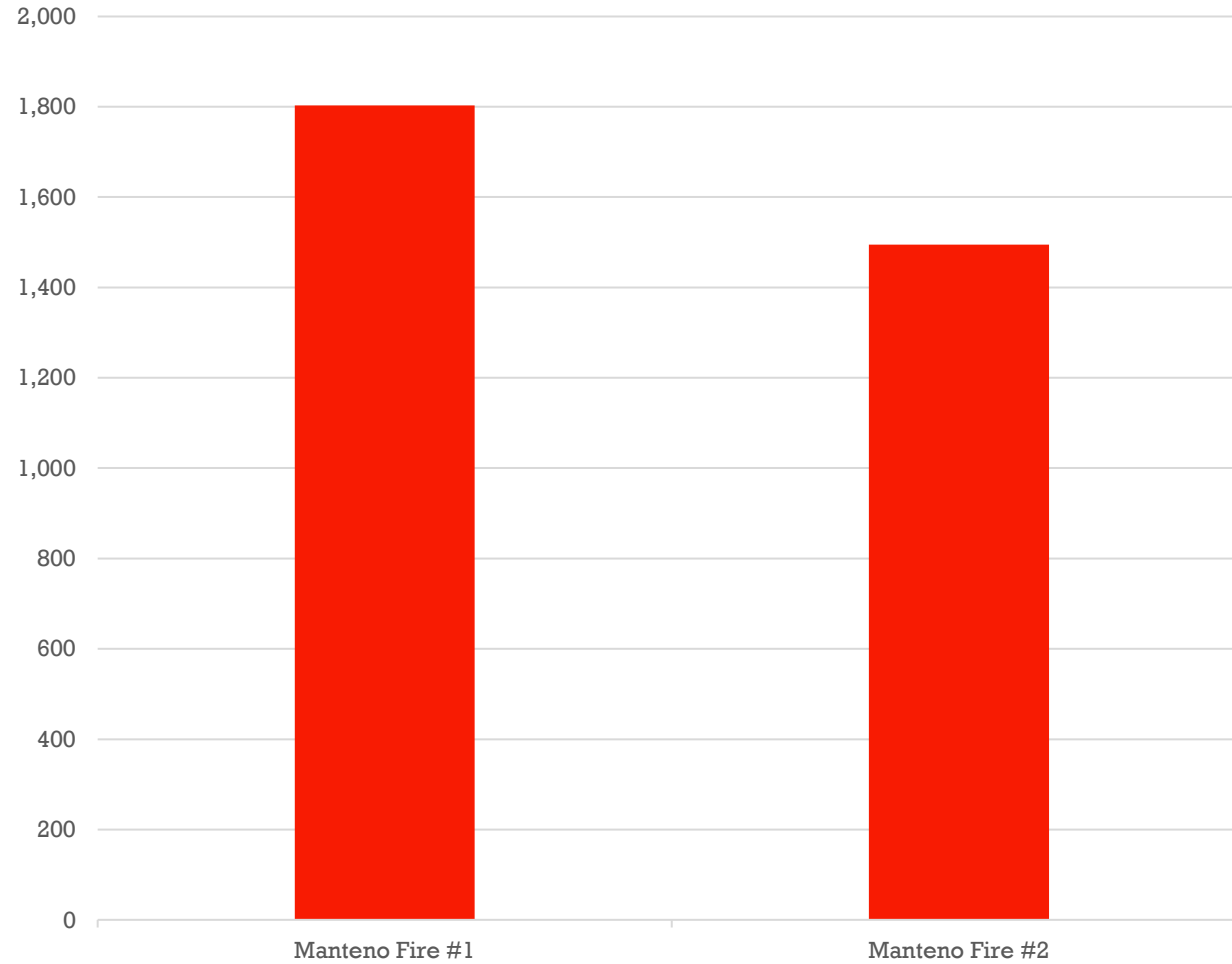


Hour of the Day Comparison - 2022



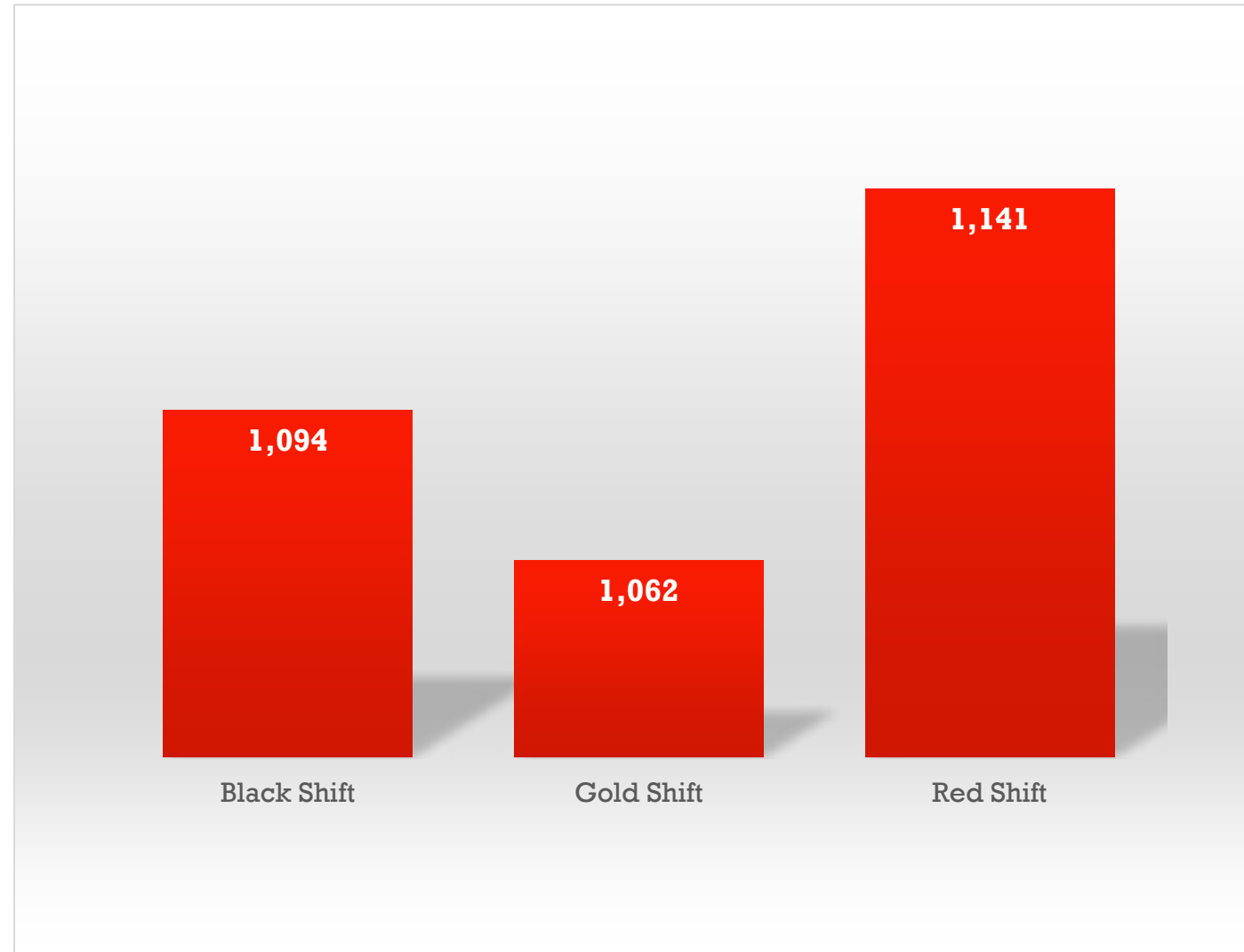


2022 Station Responses

Training



The training expectations for personnel of Manteno Community Fire Protection District includes various certification courses, seminars and conference attendance, and in house assigned daily trainings. These trainings are categorized for compliance with the fire training standards which are regulated by several organizations including the Office of State Fire Marshal, the National Fire Protection Association, the Insurance Services Organization and the Occupational Safety and Health Administration. Furthermore, Riverside Medical Center (our resource hospital) is tasked with providing monthly continuing education for all our EMS providers and assures our compliance with Illinois Department of Public Health Emergency Medical Services standards.

During 2022, Manteno Community Fire Protection District personnel dedicated 6,257 staff hours to fire related training activities and an additional 678 staff hours to EMS related training.

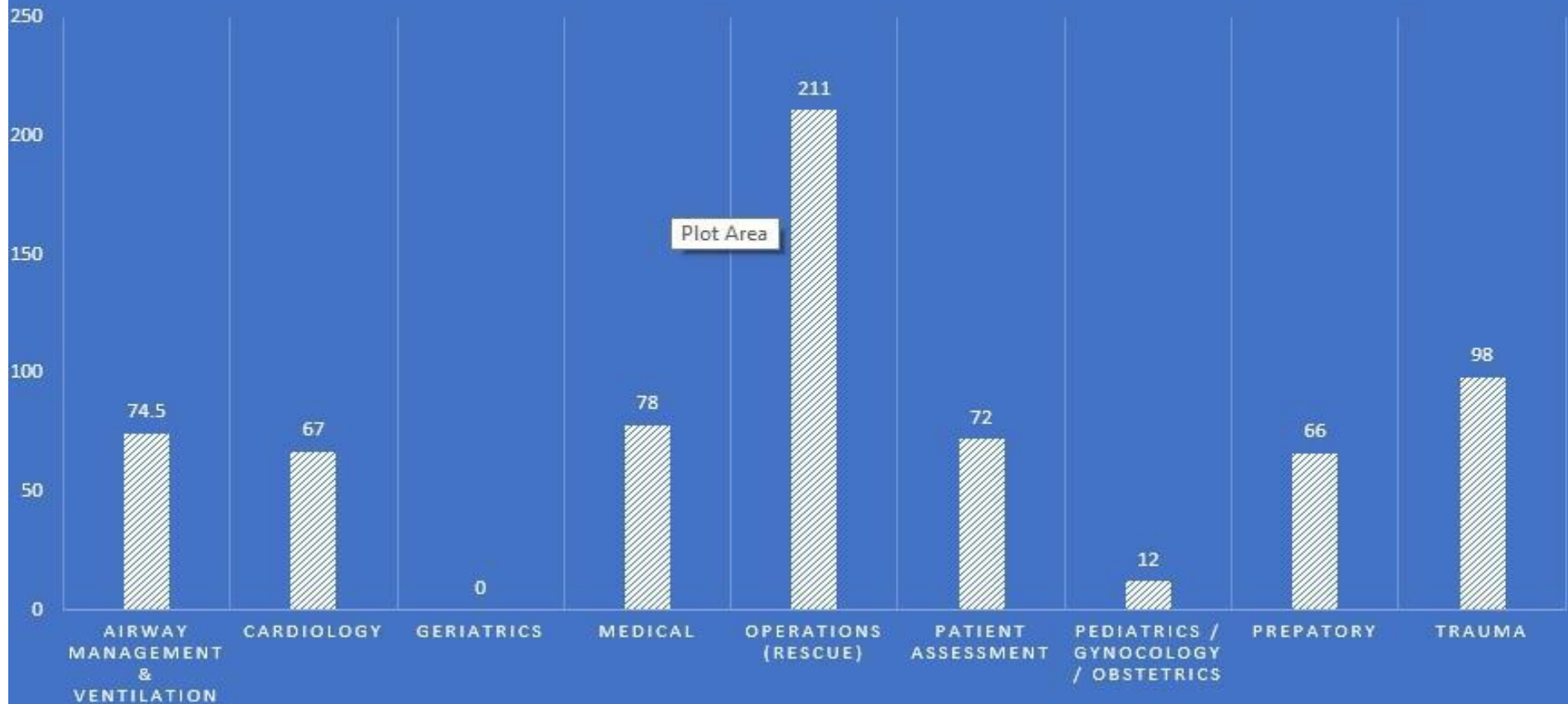


2022 FIRE / RESCUE / EMS TRAINING HOURS
